The Social Work Department of the University of Bucharest is pleased to invite submissions for presentations at the 2nd edition of the *Social Work International Conference (SWIC)* to be held in Bucharest on **November 2nd – 3rd, 2017**.

The conference theme, *Social Work Responses to the New Realities of a Turbulent World*, seeks to gather contributions focusing on social work related-issues against the background of a fast-changing world. In the context of a reflexive society, characterized by a constant interplay between action, its interpretations and re-action (Beck, 1992), the need to understand and review social work's responses becomes imperative. In recent years, we have witnessed the emergence of new social risks/problems, as a consequence of a myriad of socio-political factors. Social work is a dynamic profession and field of study with a mandate to properly interpret social changes and to act and re-act to the most pressing social needs created by world changes, such as the economic crisis in 2008 and the subsequent austerity measures, the social problems created by armed conflicts and issues pertaining to the intensification of transnational migration, etc. Rapid technological advancements have enhanced the exchange of information across various settings, which has the potential of contributing to increasing our awareness of social risks and, ultimately, to generating concrete actions for redefining the social order.

We welcome scientifically sound and original contributions from researchers, educators, practitioners, and students from social science in the areas listed below.

Submissions can be empirical, theoretical or practice based. We accept submissions from both experienced researchers/practitioners and undergraduate, master and PhD students.

Presentation types include individual or co-authored papers, poster presentations, and organized workshops. The papers will be selected based on criteria such as: compliance with the conference theme, relevance, actuality of the subject.

Title of the presentation

Name and affiliation of the author(s)

3-5 key-words

The abstract body (300 words or less, maximum 3000 characters) should include:

- Background
- Purpose
- Methodology
- Results and/or practice implications
- General conclusion
